But here is the thing. There's nothing wrong with overeating at fun celebrations. But what happens when we choose to live our life that way all the time?

How many of you have a WII Fit? WII Fit is a Nintendo videogame that is supposed to help you get in shape. And the game comes with a board that you stand on to weigh yourself. And if you weigh a certain amount, when you get on it, you know what it does? It goes, "UGHHH". As if I'm practically smashing the poor board. And I don't like that!

And I have come to the conclusion that there's a way of living that finds the WII Fit mocking me. There's a way of living that leads to unhealthy choices and death. And then, there's a way of living where I eat healthy and I exercise appropriately and I make healthy choices. And the WII Fit board doesn't get to mock me!

We try harder and harder...we make rules and more rules... And yet, we find ourselves confessing the same thing over and over and over. So how do we get from this way of living to that way? Well, that brings us to Easter. I hope to see you this coming Sunday as we continue this story.




