Three days passed as they, Watched the stony place. The death shroud then fell, They looked upon His face.


Heaven could no longer, Hold back their voice; Their silence was broken, In harmonic rejoice.

#### PASTOR'S CHAT Pastor Nicholas Gleason

Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you well and blessed. When I was in seminary, I worked as a youth leader of this old Methodist church. There was this member who was a corporate pilot. He once agreed to fly me home to Chicago.

I was impressed and comforted by the care he took in planning the trip. One thing that sticks in my mind is how carefully he planned his "approach." As he planned, he would have charts in front of him that he would consult. He would call for weather reports so he would know wind direction and speed, as well as, visibility. Finally he would always check the elevation (how high above sea level) of the airport. In his words, "It's always good to know where the ground is when you are landing."

Last month we began the season of Lent. Lent is the 40 day period (not including Sundays) we spend preparing for Easter. This month, as we continue through our journey of Lent and approach Easter, we need to plan our "approach".

My friend will tell you that a good approach makes for a good landing. If we hope to celebrate Easter in the way God would hope, then we need to plan our approach.

Those diagrams and charts helped my friend approach the ground. Are you taking these 40 days to renew your commitment to reading the Bible?

My friend always called to check on the weather conditions. Part of our approach to Easter this year should include talking with spiritual mentors in our lives. Each of us should have people in our lives that are farther along on their journey with God then we are. Who are these people for you? Are you finding time to sit with them and talk to them?

My friend said it is always good to know where the ground is. As you approach Easter, are you also spending time grounding yourself in prayer? Prayer is more than a time for us to ask God for what we want. It is a time to connect with God, to be grounded.

May the journey be meaningful, rich, and grace-filled. And, may each of us arrive on Easter with a renewed heart and a deepened faith.

# LAY LEADER'S LINE

One night a clergyman was walking to church when a thief pulled a gun on him and demanded his money or his life. When he reached into his pocket to hand over his wallet, the robber saw his clerical collar and said, "I see you are a priest. Never mind, you can go." The clergyman, surprised by the robber's unexpected act of piety, offered him a candy bar. The robber said, "No thank you. I gave up candy for Lent."

The man had given up candy as a supposed sacrifice for Lent, but his lifestyle of stealing showed his real character! According to Proverbs 20:11, conduct is the best indicator of character (*Even a child is known by his actions, by whether what he does is pure and right.*) In the 23<sup>rd</sup> chapter of Matthew, Jesus issues a series of "woes" upon the religious establishment of His generation. He refers to them as "hypocrites", a word that describes someone who hides behind a mask. Jesus exposed the hypocritical attitudes of the religious leaders. They knew the scriptures, but did not live by them. They didn't care about being holy- just looking holy in order to receive the people's admiration and praise.

Today, like the Pharisees, many people who know the Bible, do not let it change their lives. They say they follow Jesus, but don't live by His standards of love. People who live this way are hypocrites. Appearances and words are deceiving; behavior is the best judge of character. This applies to all of us. We must make sure that our actions match our beliefs.

As followers of Jesus, we demonstrate our love for Him by what we do, not just by what we say. May our devotion to God, because of His love for us, be revealed in our actions today.


