PASTOR'S CHAT

Pastor Nicholas Gleason

Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you well and blessed. As I sit down to write this letter to you, I am watching the scenes of the Boston Marathon tragedy play over and over on my television. Every year approximately 20,000 people, young and old, gather in Boston to run in one of the most prestigious marathons in the world. Approximately 500,000 more come to cheer them on. I can't imagine what could be pleasurable about running 26 miles. But it is an exultant moment in the lives of the runners and their cheerleaders.

Until this year's race, when just before 3 PM, someone or some people decided to turn this exultant moment into a moment of death and destruction. The devastation was felt when two bombs exploded and stole this world of three precious lives and the innocence and security of many more.

As I am sitting watching the news coverage, my heart is sinking deep into the pit of my stomach, as the reporter shares the story of 8-year-old Martin Richard, whose life was one of the three stolen from us in this act of terror. His little sister, Jane, who is only 7, lies in the hospital suffering from grievous injuries to her legs. Their mother, Denise, was so badly hurt in the blast that she went under immediate emergency surgery and barely held on to her life. Can you imagine having to walk through this moment that the Richards family is abiding in?

Jane Sherman, a neighbor of the family, tells media that "there are no words to describe how they are feeling...we are feeling."

My heart sank even deeper. I think millions across this world share this sentiment, "there are no words to describe how...we are feeling."

And yet, I find hope from a very unlikely source, comedian Patton Oswalt. On Wednesday, April 17th, the Chicago Tribune reported on a widely circulated Facebook message, in which Oswalt promises that good people still outnumber the bad.

"I remember, when 911 went down, my reaction was, 'well, I've had it with humanity.' But I was wrong. I don't know what is going to be revealed to be behind all of this mayhem. One human insect or a poisonous mass of broken sociopaths. But here's what I do know. If it's one person or a hundred people, that number is not even a fraction of a fraction of a fraction of a percent of the population on this planet."

His message concludes by saying, "So when you spot violence, or bigotry, or intolerance, or fear, or just garden variety misogyny, hatred or ignorance, just look it in the eye and think, 'the good outnumber you, and we always will."

In life, as we push forth to that finish line, we can spend time focusing on what we don't have, the bad that is done to us, the ugly people around us. Or we can remember that the good outnumbers the bad. We can focus on what God has blessed us with, the goodness God pours out on us and the incredible people we are simply lucky enough to share this life with.

In moments like this, we often ask why. We ask how we can stop this from happening again. The heartbreaking truth is I don't think we can. Evil has always existed and will always exist in this imperfect world. There will always be some form of evil trying to creep into our lives. But we don't have to let it destroy our lives. We can remember the good still outnumbers the bad.

Instead of allowing the hatred of a fraction of a fraction of a fraction of a percent of the population on this planet tear away the love and hopefulness of our heart, let us take a moment to remember the words of the Scripture.

The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing.

Zephaniah 3:17

How can we possibly show love and hopefulness even amongst challenging situations? Goodness comes from a place in our hearts. It comes from a focus on God. So this is my challenge for you. Let us not become weary. God never promised us that life would be easy, but God did promise to never forsake us. God did promise to walk along beside us each and every day. God did promise to be with us through each trial we face. And God did promise to lift us up when we are down. Consider how you have seen God's goodness shining throughout this tragedy in Boston.

Finally, let us challenge ourselves with the words of Jesus.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..."

Matthew 5:43-44

In times of darkness, we must let God's goodness and hope shine forth as we offer this prayer in His name.

In darkness help me call on your name, Jesus. Be the light of my heart; may I never be afraid. In your mercy, give me the gift of hope. And by your love, help me to love others.

Help me to seek the values that will bring lasting joy in this changing world. Grant this through Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

And may you discover this blessing each and every day of your life, through the good times, and through your trials.

I'm watching the second round of the Masters Golf Tournament while I'm writing this article. The commentators make frequent references to "making the cut" At the Masters, the lowest 44 golfers' score, if they are within 10 strokes of the leader, make the cut and get to play the next day. Every year, high-school seniors apply to their favorite universities and watch the mailbox for the letter announcing their acceptance. Youth of all ages will try-out for their favorite sport hoping to 'make the team'.

"Make the cut", "make the team", "get accepted" are phrases we have all grown up with indicating that you can be part of the 'chosen'. Even in New Testament times, Jewish boys would often attend rabbinical schools until age 13. Then only the best and the brightest would be chosen to "follow" the local rabbi. This small, select group of disciples would go where he went and eat what he ate-modeling their lives after the rabbi. Those who didn't make the cut would pick up a trade like carpentry, sheep-herding, or fishing. Joe Stowell of RBC Ministries puts it this way:

[Guys like Simon, Andrew, James, and John hadn't made the cut. So instead of following the local rabbi, they were down by the docks, knee-deep in the family business. It's interesting that Jesus sought out the men the local rabbi had rejected. Instead of targeting the best and brightest, Jesus offered His invitation in Matthew 4:19; "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men"

What an honor! They would become followers of the ultimate Rabbi.

Jesus extends the same honor to you and me-not because we are the best or brightest, but because He needs ordinary people like us to model His life and to lovingly rescue people on His behalf. So, follow Him and let Him make something of your life!]
