PASTOR'S CHAT

Pastor Nicholas Gleason

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well and blessed. Ok, enough with the niceness. Let's have a moment of honesty. Have you ever wanted to help me prepare for my sermons and worship service? Have you ever thought, oh brother, Nicholas has just missed the point of this Scripture teaching?

Of course not. I didn't think so. Naturally I get it right every time. Nevertheless, the IGRC RIM has asked me to invite a group of men, women, and teens to join me in my sermon and worship service preparation.

During the season of Advent, this group will meet between 6:00 PM and 7:00 PM every Thursday evening, beginning on November 28th to December 19th.

Together we will read and study the text for the upcoming sermon. We will discuss what we think this text is sharing with us. We will reflect how the sermon and the worship service can be built around this theme. We will consider the use of multi-sensory interactions within worship. And we will have time to discuss and evaluate the sermon and worship service of the past week.

This is a learning experience designed, not only to help me in my weekly preparations, but also to help me hear your experiences. Each of us is walking on the same road with the same message. But we find ourselves at different places in that journey. And God may speak to us in different ways, depending on where in this journey we are currently standing.

Your input will not only help me understand where you are in your spiritual life. But it will also help me customize our sermons and services to better fit the Otterbein United Methodist family.

I think each of you will gain as well. It is a very different experience to approach a Scripture passage with the intent of doing Biblical exegesis, than it is to simply read it for encouragement. I'm sure during our study together you will go deeper in these Scripture passages and strengthen your own understanding of God's message.

I will begin to sign up names for this study during the month of October. In November, I will pass out the Biblical passages so you will each have a few weeks to do some private reflection.

I encourage you to join us for this time together. If you have any questions, please feel free to speak with me.

The following poem appeared on the pages of my daily devotional written by a person with the last name of Young:

"Disappointment – His appointment,

Change one letter, then I see

That the thwarting of my purpose

Is God's better choice for me."

These words ring so true to me as I think of times that I've experienced delays, changes of plans, and redirections in my life. Most of the time, my first response is one of frustration or anger. But have you ever looked back to those delays and seen God's hand working through it? I read about a couple of Christians who were delayed in an airport 4000 miles from home for over 24 hours and nearly no one spoke English. One of the Christian youths, Dave, was frustrated and anxious, while the second youth, John, took the opportunity to mingle with other passengers that were being delayed as well. John "happened" to find some fellow Christians from India- and in talking to them he heard about a ministry they were involved with and they invited John to participate with them in a short term project. This project developed into a thriving ministry.

In Acts 16:9-31, Paul was taking a trip to Philippi. God directed Paul through a vision to go to Macedonia instead. Unbeknownst to Paul, God was sending him to jail! I can't help but think that somewhere along the way; Paul had second thoughts about his vision wondering if he got it right. But Paul was faithful and through the imprisonment, God led Paul to bring salvation to a Jailer and his family. The Holy Spirit guides us to the right places, but He also guides us away from the wrong places! As we seek God's will, it is important to know what God wants us to do and where He wants us to go, but it is equally important to know what God does not want us to do and where He does not want us to go. God can use inconveniences in our lives if we look at them as divine appointments.
