PASTOR'S CHAT Pastor Nicholas Gleason

Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you well and blessed. The other day I was driving by an elementary school, as the children were being let out. One little boy, probably in kindergarten, caught my eye. He was so excited to see his Mom (or to be out of school) that he began to run as fast as his little legs could take him. He ran so hard; he could barely keep his backpack from bouncing off his shoulders!

His Mom squatted down to catch him in her arms, but Mom and son's timing was just a tad bit off. And when the son jumped into his Moms arms, he knocked her over. The two just laid there for a second, holding each other as tight as each could.

While I got a good laugh out of that little boy running as fast as he could, and knocking his Mom over, the story also challenges me. I wonder how often my heavenly Father waits for me to run to him in that way?

I went to this clergy gathering last week, and we sang the song "Forever Reign". These lyrics from the refrain begin to tug at my heart:

Oh, I'm running to Your arms, I'm running to Your arms, The riches of Your love Will always be enough Nothing compares to Your embrace Light of the world forever reign.

"I'm running to Your arms, the riches of Your love will always be enough". That simple statement of truth and grace is enough to cause us to run to God. That is my challenge to each of us, are we ready to run into God's arms?

Most of us are running. Running away from something that hurts us. Running towards something that excites us. But, whatever we need is found in running to those waiting arms of Jesus.

The other thing I want to point out. I wasn't the only one watching that little school boy jumping into his Mom's arms. That little boy caught the eyes of every teacher and parent in the school yard. It had an impact. Deep down, those other parents were probably wishing their kid had greeted them in the same way.

So, "run to Him" and watch what happens. People will notice. People will smile. People will come. And in time, they too will "run to His arms" and discover the richness of His grace and the joy of His church.

LAY LEADER'S LINE

This being an election year, along with baseball playoffs, and the NFL getting in gear, makes the last 3 months of this year an interesting one. Passions for a particular political party, baseball or football team seems to reverberate in the air around coffee shop table discussions, employees at workplaces and wherever a group of people are gathered. A person can't help but over-hear debates over who to vote for, the World Series predictions or football both college and pro. It's sometimes funny to hear people lay their rationale for their particular stance and then listen to the response of someone who disagrees with similar rationale for their position. Usually neither side ever convinces the other side. The two parties just agree to disagree.

This raises a question in my mind. Are there times when a Christian *shouldn't* talk about God? Randy Kilgore who writes for 'The Daily Bread' puts it this way; "In the face of insincere challenges to our faith, silence may often be the best response." When Jesus was before the Sanhedrin and false evidence was being presented Caiaphas, the high priest, we see Jesus' reaction in Matthew 26:62-63;" Then the high priest stood up and said to Jesus, "Are you not going to answer? What is this testimony that these men are bringing against you?" But Jesus remained silent......" In this hostile exchange with Caiaphas, Jesus chose silence at first. He understood that Caiaphas wasn't interested in the truth. While we don't always know another's heart, we must be sensitive to the leading of the Spirit in every situation that "we may know how to answer everyone" (Col. 4:6)

When are some of these times that we might want to be silent? How about at work while on the clock when the discussion is keeping us from being a productive employee? [or] If an answer to a question will move the discussion down a rabbit trail and away from Christ? [or] If someone has shown a continual resistance, we might choose to stop pressing them. Remember, we can be a witness of God's grace with our conduct and work ethic as well.
